1290: Expulsion of Jewish communities from England

1306: Expulsion of Jewish communities from France

1320: The Pastoreaux Crusade. The Jewish quarters are under attack

1322: New expulsion of the Jewish communities from France

1348: The Black Plague Epidemic. The Jewish communities are accused of poisoning waters

1360: Synagogue of Samuel Haleví, royal treasurer, in Toledo

1391: First attacks to the Jewish neighbourhoods in the Iberian peninsula

1432: Assembly of Jewish aljamas in Valladolid, recovery of the Jewish life in Castile

1478: Tomas de Torquemada, the First Great Inquisitor

1492: Discovery of America. Conquest of Granada. Edict of expulsion of the Jews from the Hispanic kingdoms

1263: Disputation of Barcelona

1336: Peter the Cerimonious has many Jewish doctors in his court

1348: The Jewish quarters of Barcelona and Morvedre are under attack

1373: The Catalan Atlas, masterpiece of the Majorcan Jews Cresques

1391: Riots against the Jewish quarters and end of the Barcelona's Jewish community

1413-14: Disputation of Tortosa. Massive conversions

1479: Fernando and Isabel, the Catholic Kings. Union between the crowns of Catalonia-Aragon and Castile.

1484: The Inquisition in Catalonia

1492: Expulsion of the Jews from Catalonia

1279: Astruch Ravaia, a Jew from Girona, is royal mayor of Catalonia

1331: The Jewish quarter is attacked

1391: Great riot in the Jewish quarter

1411: Sermon of Vicenç Ferrer, to force the conversion of the Jews

1415: The great synagogue is closed

1435: The third and last synagogue is founded

1442: Ordinances of prohibition adressed to the Jewish population

1448: Order of confinement of the Jewish families in the reduced Jewish quarter

1490-91: The Inquisition settles in Girona

1492: Expulsion of the Jews from Girona
